
God has received them (Romans 14:3)

# **Moving from Attitude to Action**

[Don't] put a stumbling block ... in a brother's way. (Romans 14:13b)



### Paul said, "I know and am convinced in the Lord Jesus..."

"Not what goes into the mouth defiles a man; but what comes out of the mouth, this defiles a man."

(Matthew 15:11)



Do not destroy with your food the one for whom **Christ died**.

You are no longer walking in love.

Verse 16

The strong: "I'm doing good!"

**Everyone else**: "You are doing **EVIL** • !"

The **Kingdom of God** is **not** but:



- Righteousness
- Peace
- Joy in the Holy Spirit.

Verse 18

He who serves Christ in these things is:

- Accepted by God
- Approved by men

### THEREFORE

let us pursue the things which make for **peace** and the things by which one may **edify** another.

Verse 20

Do not **destroy** the work of God for the sake of food.

It is evil to "eat with offense"

- The strong must not eat if they know it causes offense, or
- The weak must not eat if they believe it is wrong.

It is **good** neither to eat meat nor drink wine nor do **anything** 

by which your brother stumbles...



1 Corinthians 8:12-13

### Do you have **faith**?

# **Blessed** is he who does not **condemn himself** in what he approves.

#### Verse 23

But he who **doubts** is condemned if he eats, because he does not eat from **faith**; for whatever is not from **faith** is **sin**. Chapter 15 - Verse 1
