
1. What were the Jews expecting?

- ➤ The promise to Abraham
 - Genesis 12:1-3
- ➤ Moses' prophecy
 - Deuteronomy 18:15-19
- ➤ The promise to David
 - 2 Samuel 7:16

2. What sort of man would He be?

- > The words of the prophets
 - Isaiah 9:6-7
 - Isaiah 53
 - Isaiah 61:1-2
- > The pictures in the Old Testament
 - Abraham's sacrifice
- > John the Baptist
 - Luke 3:7-9
 - John 1:29-34





The first 30 years (up to John the Baptist's preaching)		
Matthew 3:1	2 chapters	= 7%
Mark 1:2	0 chapters	= 0%
Luke 3:1	2 chapters	= 8%
John 1:19	½ chapter	= 2%
Total	4½ chapters	= 5%

The last week (from the entry to Jerusalem)		
Matthew 21:1 to Matthew 28	8 chapters	= 29%
Mark 11:1 to Mark 16	6 chapters	= 37%
Luke 19:28 to Luke 24	4½ chapters	= 19%
John 12:12 to John 21	8½ chapters	= 40%
Total	27 chapters	= 30%

Then Jesus came from Galilee to John at the Jordan to be baptized by him.

And John tried to prevent Him, saying, "I need to be baptized by You, and are You coming to me?"

But Jesus answered and said to him, "Permit it to be so now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness." Then he allowed Him.

When He had been baptized, Jesus came up immediately from the water; and behold, the heavens were opened to Him, and He saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting upon Him.

And suddenly a voice came from heaven, saying, "This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased."

...the people were astonished at His teaching, for He taught them as one having authority, and not as the scribes.

(Matthew 7:28-29)

And the common people heard Him gladly.

(Mark 12:37)

"Why have you not brought Him?" The officers answered,

"No man ever spoke like this Man!"

(John 7:45-46)

"Who can this be? For He commands even the winds and water, and they obey Him!"

(Luke 8:25)

And Jesus went about all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and healing all kinds of sickness and all kinds of disease among the people.

(Matthew 4:23)

Jesus put out His hand and touched him, saying, "I am willing; be cleansed."
(Matthew 8:3)

Then He came and touched the open coffin, and those who carried him stood still. And He said, "Young man, I say to you, arise."

(Luke 7:14)


And all the multitudes were amazed and said, "Could this be the Son of David?"
Now when the Pharisees heard it they said, "This fellow does not cast out
demons except by Beelzebub, the ruler of the demons."

(Matthew 12:23-24)

For this reason the Jews persecuted Jesus, and sought to kill Him, **because He had done these things on the Sabbath**. But Jesus answered them, "My Father has been working until now, and I have been working."

Therefore the Jews sought all the more to kill Him, because He not only broke the Sabbath, but also said that God was His Father, making Himself equal with God.

Then, six days before the Passover, Jesus came to Bethany, where Lazarus was who had been dead, whom He had raised from the dead.
