

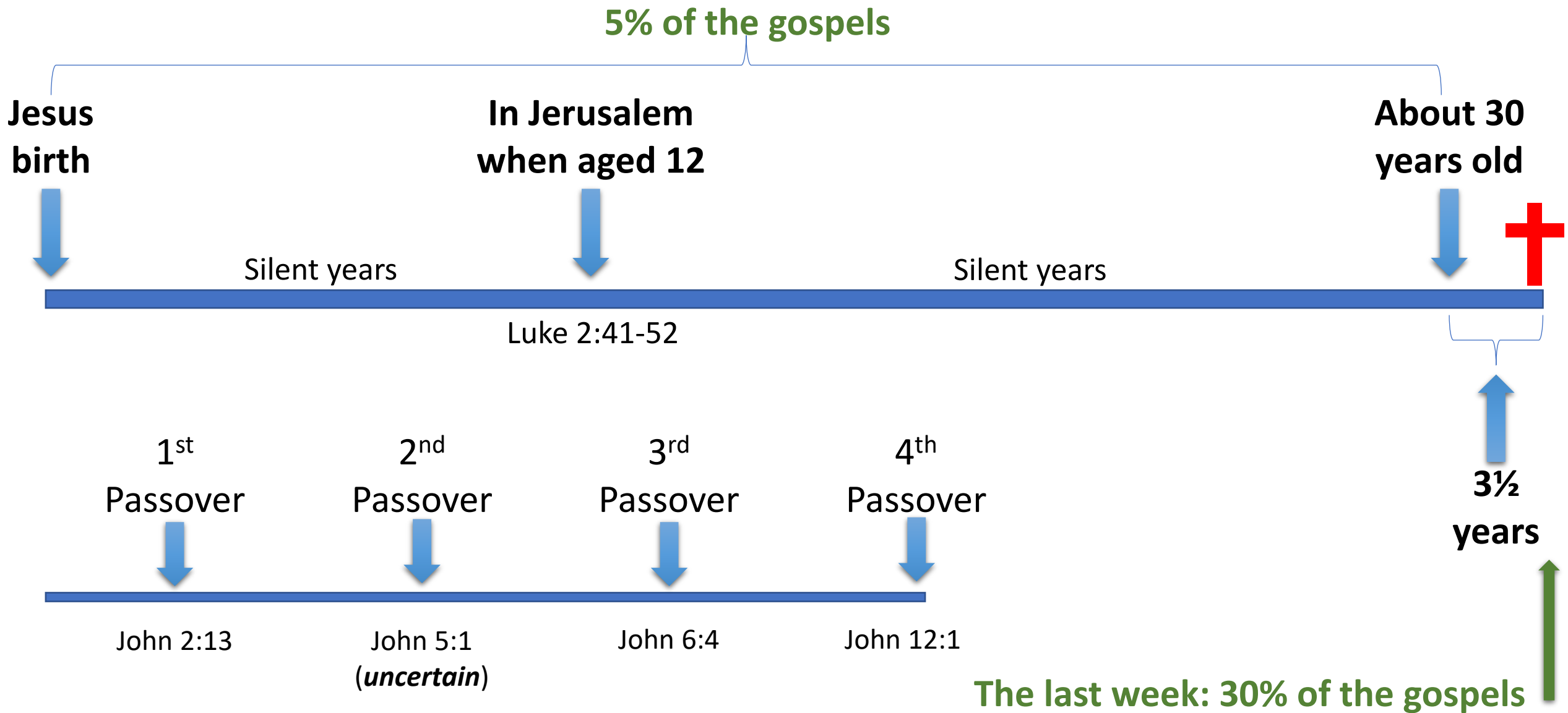


The Last Week

2. Bethany and Jerusalem

“The Word became flesh and dwelt among us...”



“The Word became flesh and dwelt among us...”

And Jesus went about all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and **healing all kinds of sickness and all kinds of disease among the people.**

(Matthew 4:23)

Jesus put out His hand and touched him, saying, **"I am willing; be cleansed."**

(Matthew 8:3)

Then He came and touched the open coffin, and those who carried him stood still. And He said, **"Young man, I say to you, arise."**

(Luke 7:14)

And the common people heard Him gladly.

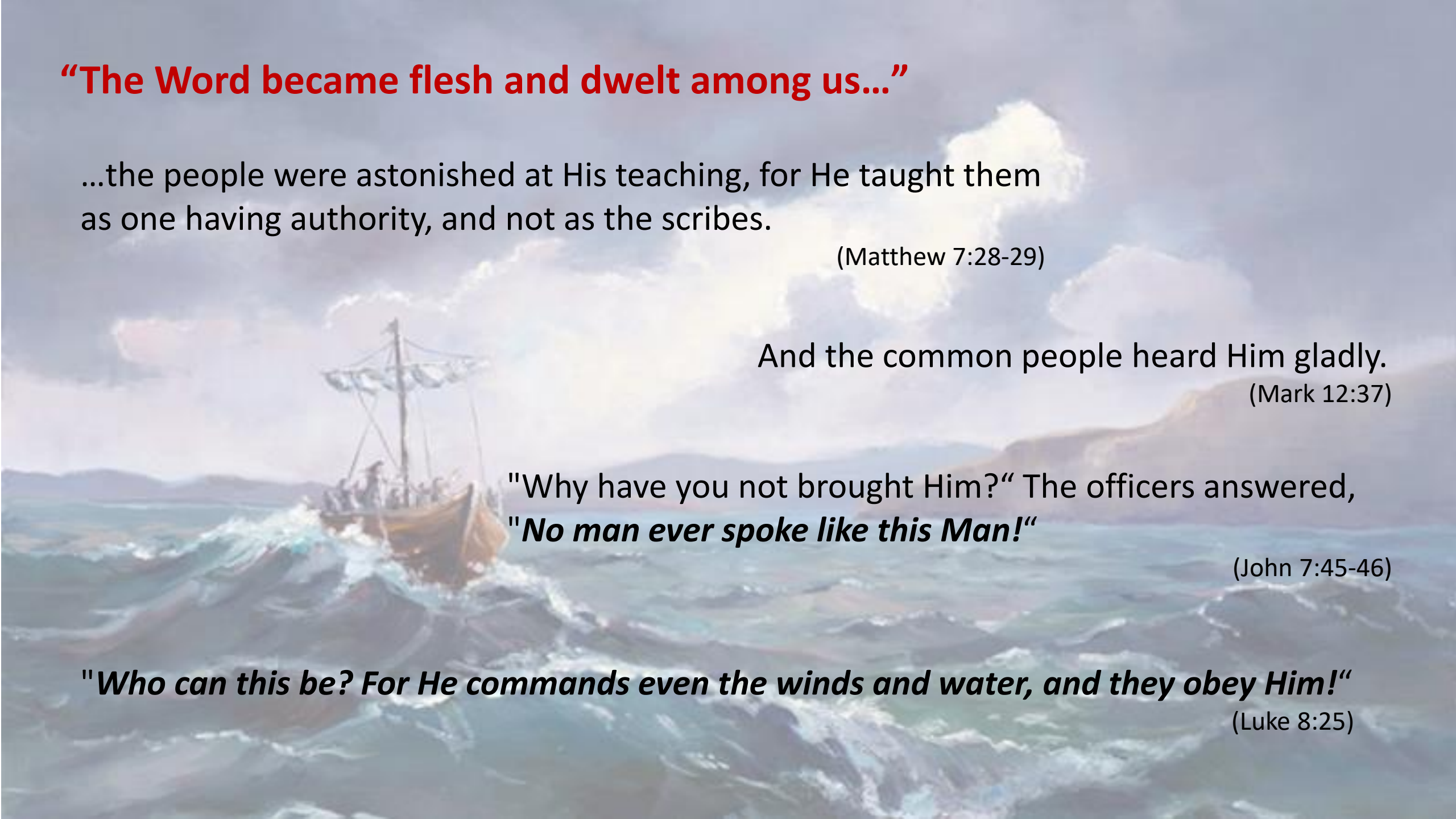
(Mark 12:37)

An overview of the last week

Saturday
(Sabbath)

Sunday

Jesus enters Jerusalem on a donkey and returns to Bethany in the evening

Monday

Jesus clears the Temple and returns to Bethany in the evening

Tuesday

Jesus is challenged by the rulers. He teaches His disciples about the last days and that night He is anointed by Mary at Bethany.

Wednesday

(Judas agrees to betray Jesus for 30 pieces of silver)

Thursday

Jesus has the **Passover meal** with the Twelve and is later arrested in Gethsemane.

Friday

Jesus is tried and crucified.

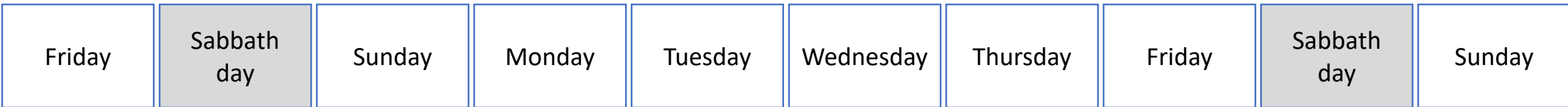

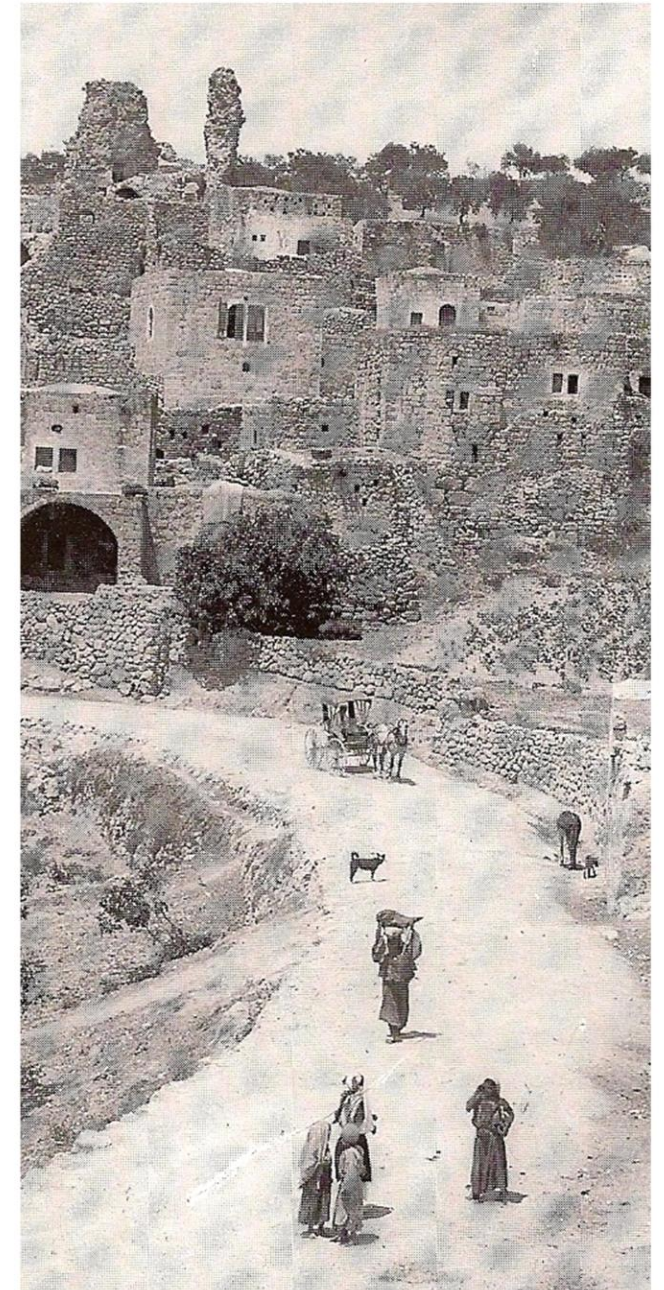
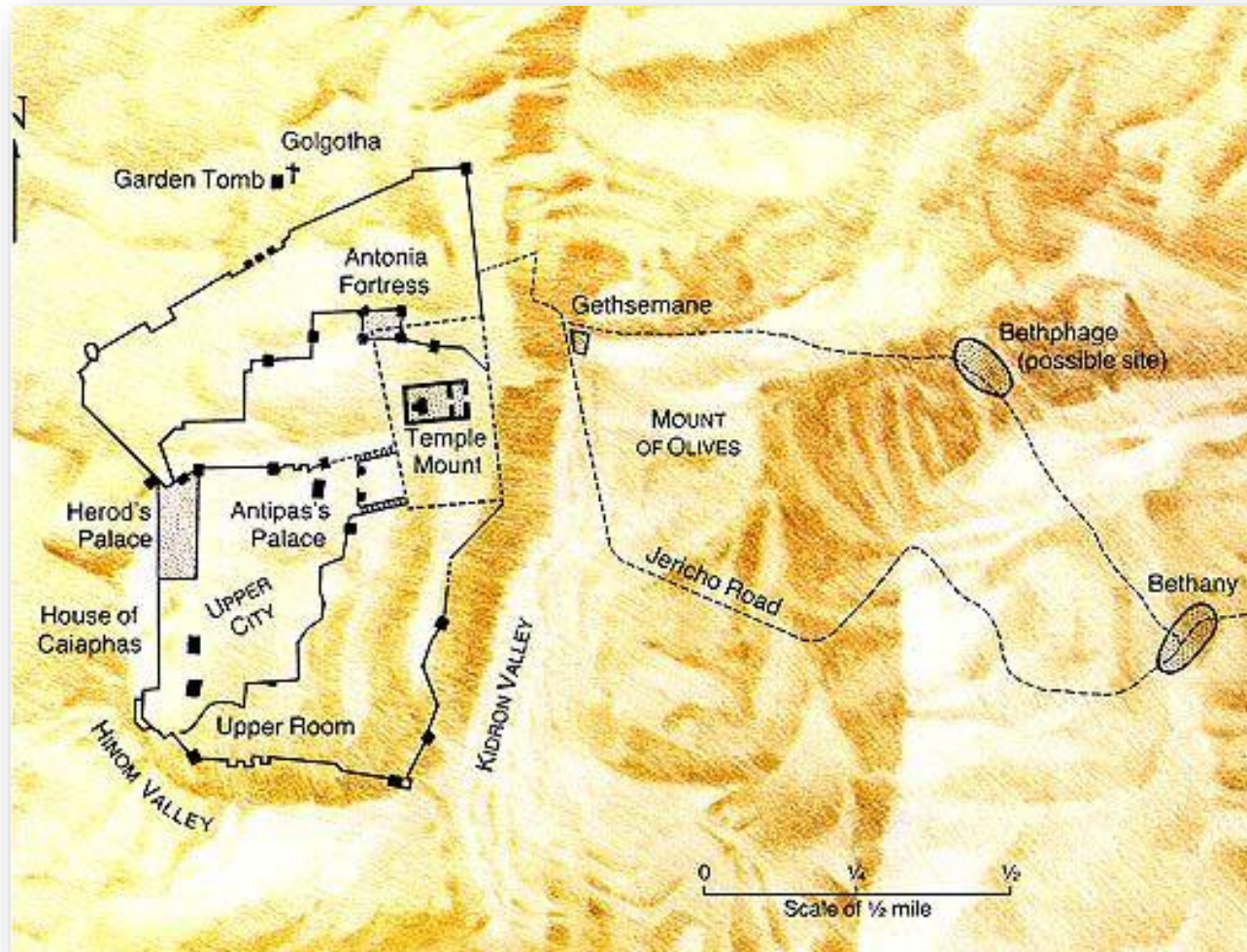


Then, six days before the Passover, Jesus came to Bethany, where Lazarus was, whom He had raised from the dead.

(John 12:1)

The village called Al-Eizariya which means "Place of Lazarus" about 100 years ago →

Bethany – What do we know?

- ❖ Mary, Martha and Lazarus
- ❖ “*Martha, Martha...*” (Luke 10:38-42)
- ❖ “Now a certain man was sick, Lazarus of Bethany, the town of Mary and her sister Martha. ...” (John 11)
- ❖ “Then, six days before the Passover, Jesus came to Bethany, ... There they made Him a supper; and Martha served, but Lazarus was one of those who reclined at the table with Him. (John 12:1-2)

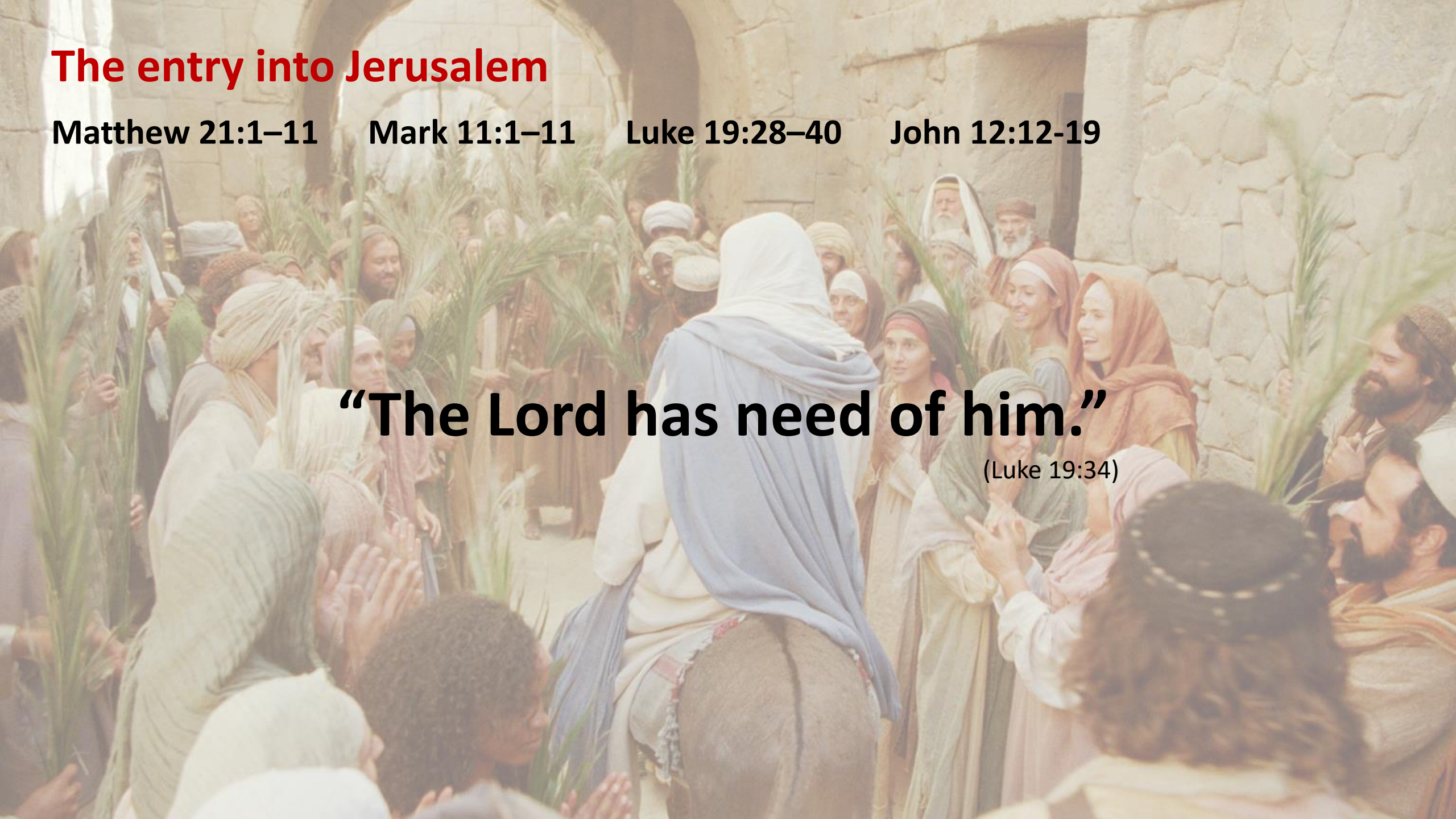

Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!”*

And some of the Pharisees called to Him from the crowd,
“Teacher, rebuke Your disciples.”

But He answered and said to them,

the stones would immediately cry out.”**

(Luke 19:37-40)

*“If you had known, even you, especially **in this your day**, the things that make for your peace!*

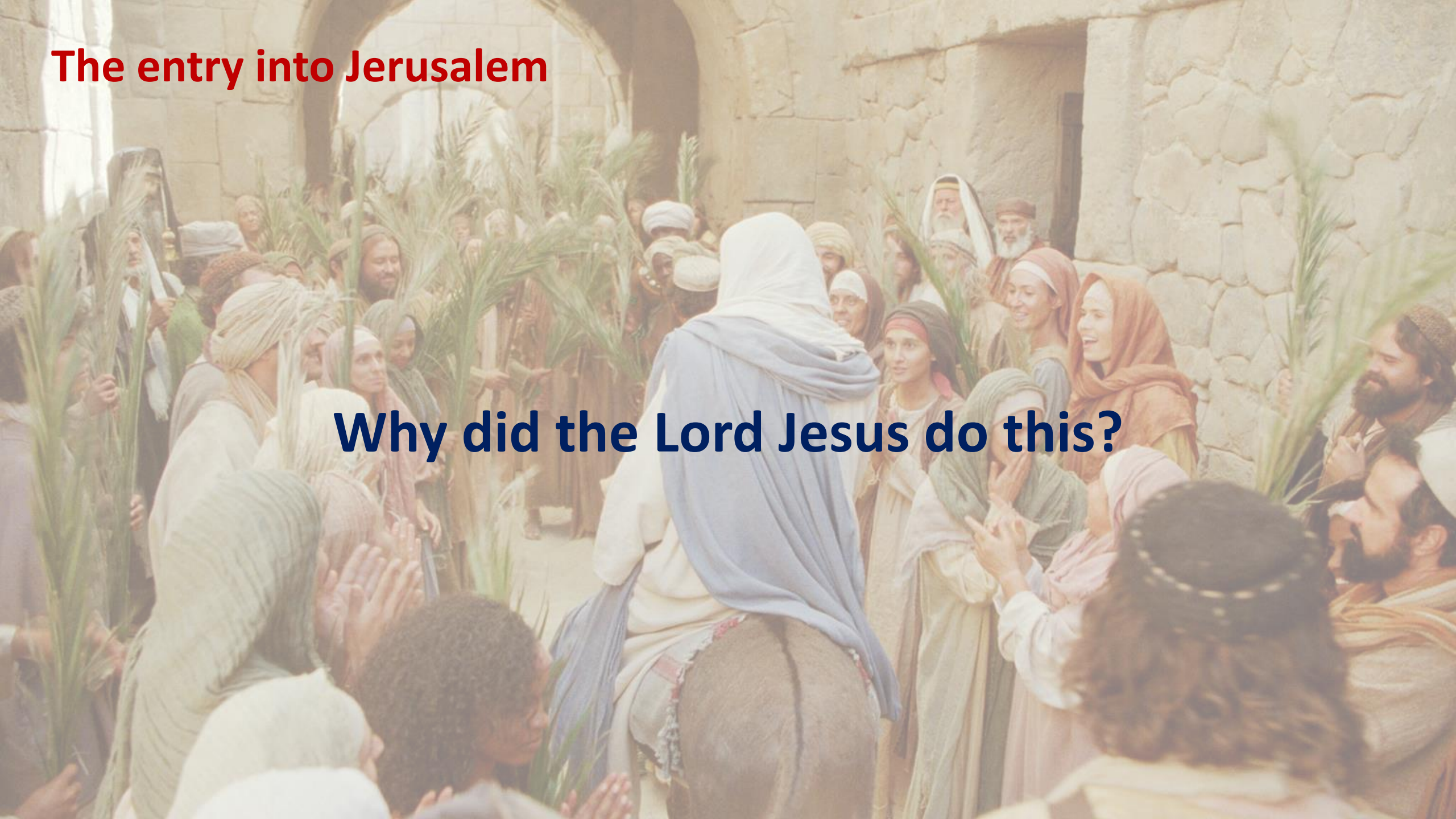
But now they are hidden from your eyes ...

Daniel 9:24-25

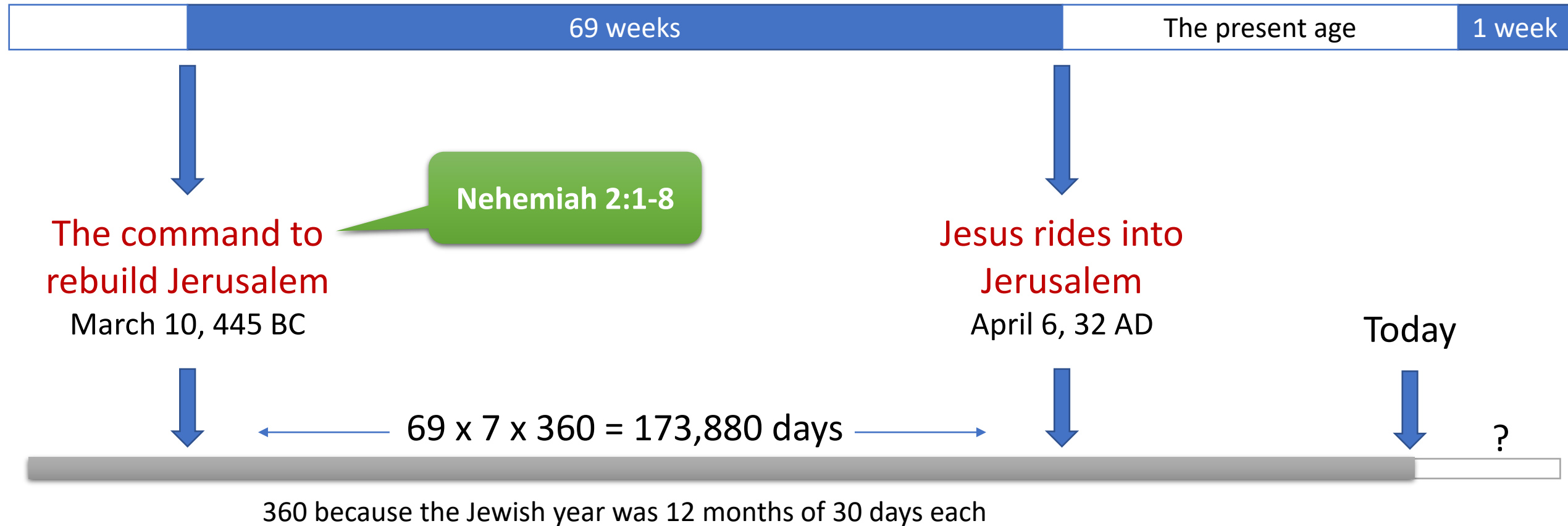
**"I tell you that if these should keep silent,

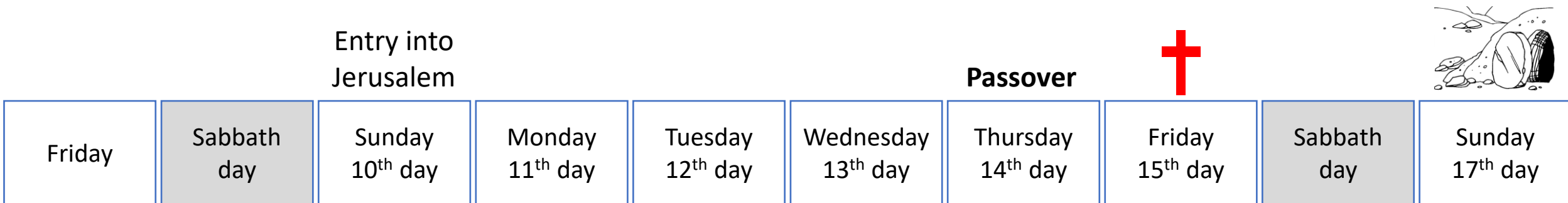
The entry into Jerusalem


On the **tenth of this month** every man shall take for himself a lamb ...

Now you shall keep it until **the fourteenth day** of the same month.

Then the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel shall kill it at twilight.

(Exodus 12:3,6)
