Saturday


(Sabbath)

Monday	Jesus clears the Temple and returns to Bethany in the evening			
Tuesday	Jesus is challenged by the rulers. He teaches His disciples about the last days and that night He is anointed by Mary at Bethany.			
Wednesday	(Judas agrees to betray Jesus for 30 pieces of silver)			
Thursday	Jesus has the Passover meal with the Twelve and is later arrested in Gethsemane.	t		
Friday	Jesus is tried and crucified.	Friday	Sabbath day	Sunday

(Mark 11:24)

1. By what **authority** do you do these things?




The trap:

You have to have authority from someone to teach

The Lord's answer:

"The baptism of John—was it from heaven or from men? Answer me."

(Mark 11:29-30)





Three parables

The obedience of two sons

(Matthew 21:28-32)

The vineyard and the servants of the owner (Matthew 21:33-46)

The wedding feast and the unwilling guests (Matthew 22:1-14)

The first parable:

The first: I will not – but later he did go.

The second: I will – but he did not.

"Which of the two did the will of his father?" (Matthew 21:31)

John came to you in the way of righteousness, and you did not believe him...

(Matthew 21:32)



Pay attention to what you hear...

For whoever has, to him more will be given; but whoever does not have, even what he has will be taken away from him. (Mark 4:24a, 25)



2. Should we pay **taxes** to Caesar or not?



The trap: Are you a rebel or are you a traitor?

The Lord's answer:

"Render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's."

(Mark 12:17)

And they marveled at Him...



3. Do you believe in the **resurrection**?



The trap:

The Sadducees did not believe there was a resurrection...

The Lord's answer:

"You are mistaken, not knowing the Scriptures nor the power of God." (Matthew 22:29)



'I am the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob.' **God is not the God of the dead, but of the living**." (Matthew 22:32)

4. Which is the **greatest commandment**?



The trap:

They want to show that He has missed something important...

The Lord's answer:

'You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the **first** and **great** commandment.

And the **second** is like it: 'You shall love your neighbour as yourself.' (Matthew 22:37-39)

The Lord's question...

"What do you think about the Christ? Whose son is he?"

"The Son of David."

Psalm 110:1 *The LORD said to my Lord, "Sit at My right hand, Till I make Your enemies Your footstool"*

And no one was able to answer Him a word, nor from that day on did anyone dare question Him anymore. (Matthew 22:46)
