(Hebrews 13:22, Acts 13:15)

An overview of Hebrews 2:5-18

- 1. God's purpose for mankind has not yet been accomplished, "but we see Jesus..." (v. 5-9)
- 2. His humiliation and suffering were necessary (v. 10-16)
- 3. He has become a merciful and faithful High Priest (v. 17-18)

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Psalm 8:

What is man...?

You have made him a little lower than the angels; You have crowned him with glory and honour...



Hebrews 2:9

Or "for a little while"

But we see Jesus,

who was made a little lower than the angels, for the suffering of death crowned with glory and honour, that He, by the grace of God, might taste death for everyone.

Experience

But we see Jesus...

God will accomplish
His eternal purpose in mankind
through His Son.

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It was entirely appropriate

Hebrews 2:10

For it was fitting for Him, for whom are all things and by whom are all things, in **bringing many sons to glory**, to make **the captain of their salvation** perfect through sufferings.

"A man of sorrows and acquainted with grief" (Isaiah 53:3)

To set apart, make holy

For both He who sanctifies and those who are being sanctified are all of one...

(Hebrews 2:11)

"Out of one, all"

"I am ascending to My Father and your Father, and to My God and your God."

(John 20:17)

Sanctification:

Two aspects, one goal...

1. To be accounted righteous in God's sight – Hebrews 10:10

2. On going transformation – 1 Thessalonians 4:3



For both He who sanctifies and those who are being sanctified are all of one, for which reason

He is not ashamed to call them brethren...

(Hebrews 2:11)

Saying...

Psalm 22:22

"I will declare Your name to My brethren; In the midst of the assembly I will sing praise to You."

(Hebrews 2:12)

Dependence, faith, obedience

Isaiah 8:17

"I will put My trust in Him."

(Hebrews 2:13)

Isaiah 8:18

"Here am I and the children whom God has given Me."

(Hebrews 2:13)

"All that the Father gives Me will come to Me..."
(John 6:37)

Inasmuch then as the children have partaken of flesh and blood, He Himself likewise shared in the same...

(Hebrews 2:14)

Mankind, by nature, through creation.

The Son, by choice, through incarnation.

To die, He had to become man...

...that through death

He might destroy him who has the power of death...

(Hebrews 2:14)

To make ineffective, useless, break the power

"He was a murderer from the beginning..."

(John 8:44)



Having disarmed principalities and powers...

(Colossians 2:15)

that through death
He might destroy him who has the power of death
and release those who through fear of death
were all their lifetime subject to bondage.

(Hebrews 2:15)

Lifelong slavery



He has delivered us from the power of darkness and conveyed us into the kingdom of the Son of His love.

(Colossians 1:13)

For indeed He does not give aid to angels, but He does give aid to the seed of Abraham.

(Hebrews 2:16)

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
It was necessary

Therefore,

in all things He had to be made like His brethren, that He might be a merciful and faithful High Priest to make propitiation for the sins of the people.

(Hebrews 2:17)

Or atonement



(Daniel 9:24)

...a merciful and faithful High Priest...

For in that **He Himself has suffered, being tempted**, He is able to aid those who are tempted.

(Hebrews 2:18)



A merciful and faithful High Priest...

"...to make propitiation for the sins of the people."

"...to aid those who are tempted."
