Jesus enters Jerusalem on a donkey and returns to Bethany in the evening

Jesus clears the Temple and returns to Bethany in the evening

Jesus is challenged by the rulers. He teaches His disciples about the last days and that night He is anointed by Mary at Bethany.

(Judas agrees to betray Jesus for 30 pieces of silver)

Jesus has the **Passover meal** with the Twelve and is later arrested in Gethsemane.

Jesus is tried and crucified.



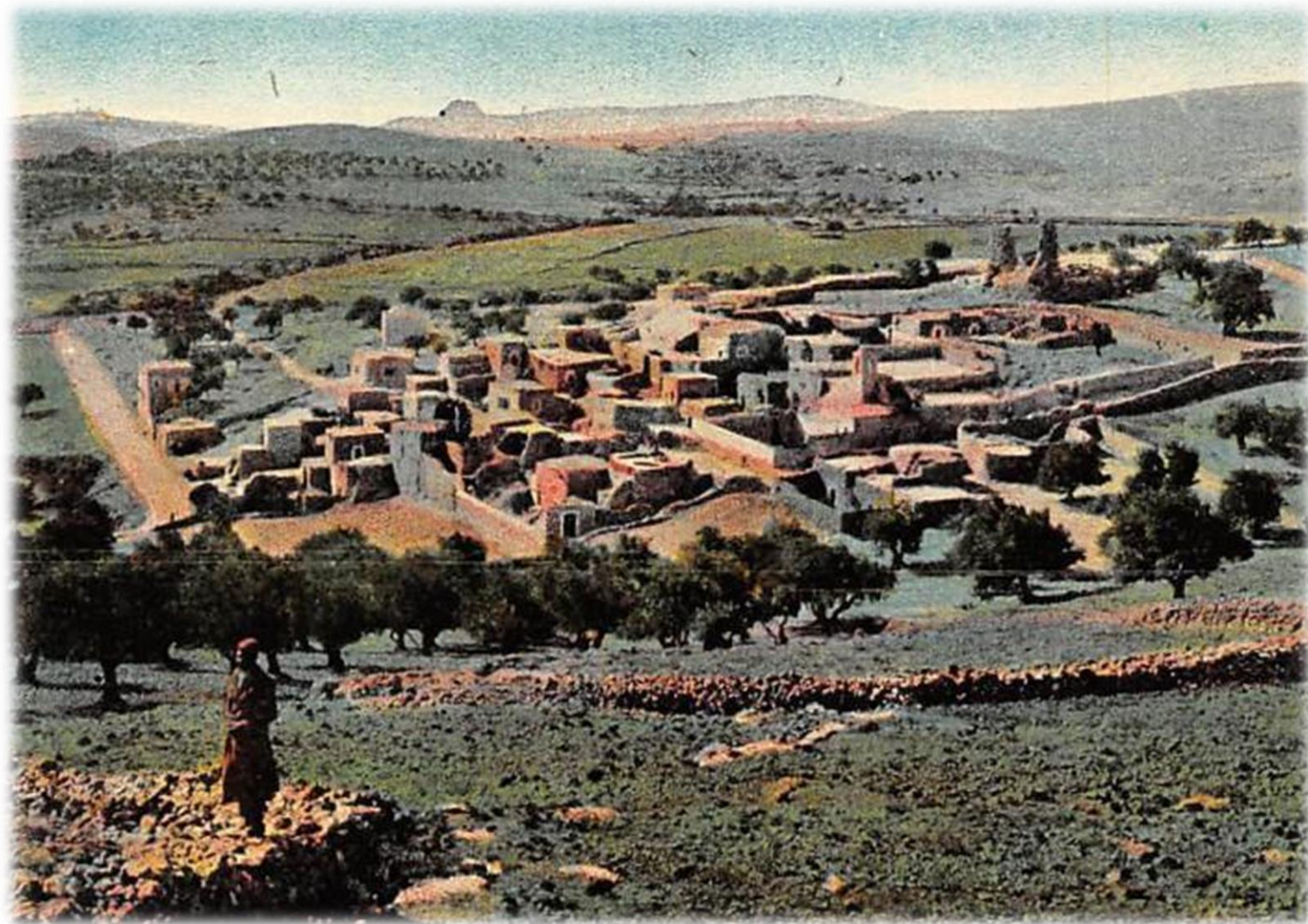
There they made Him a supper...

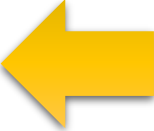

And when I see the blood, I will pass over you.



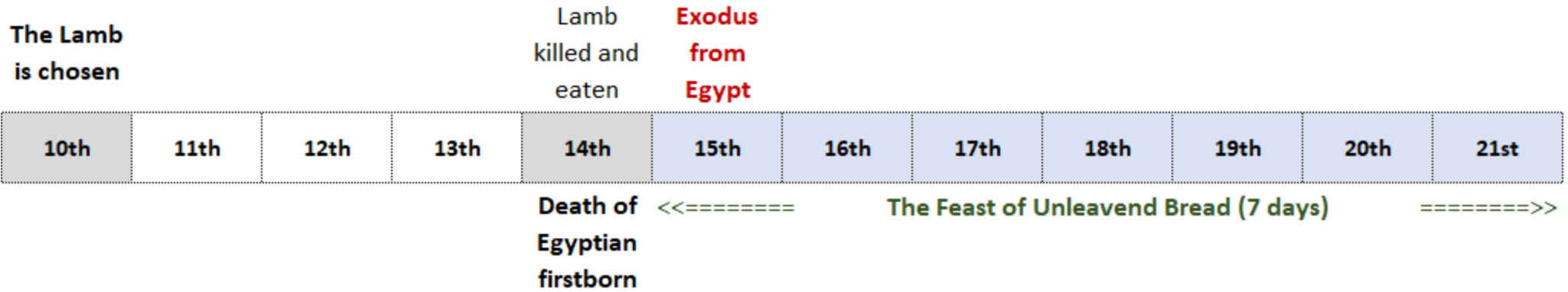
Now on the first day of the **Feast of the Unleavened Bread**
the disciples came to Jesus, saying to Him,



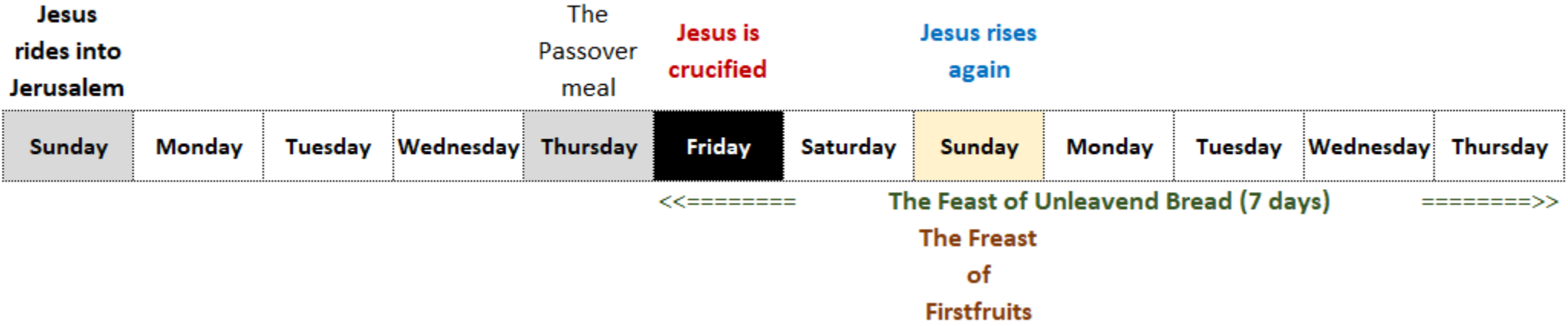
“Where do You want us to prepare for You to eat **the Passover?**”

The last week





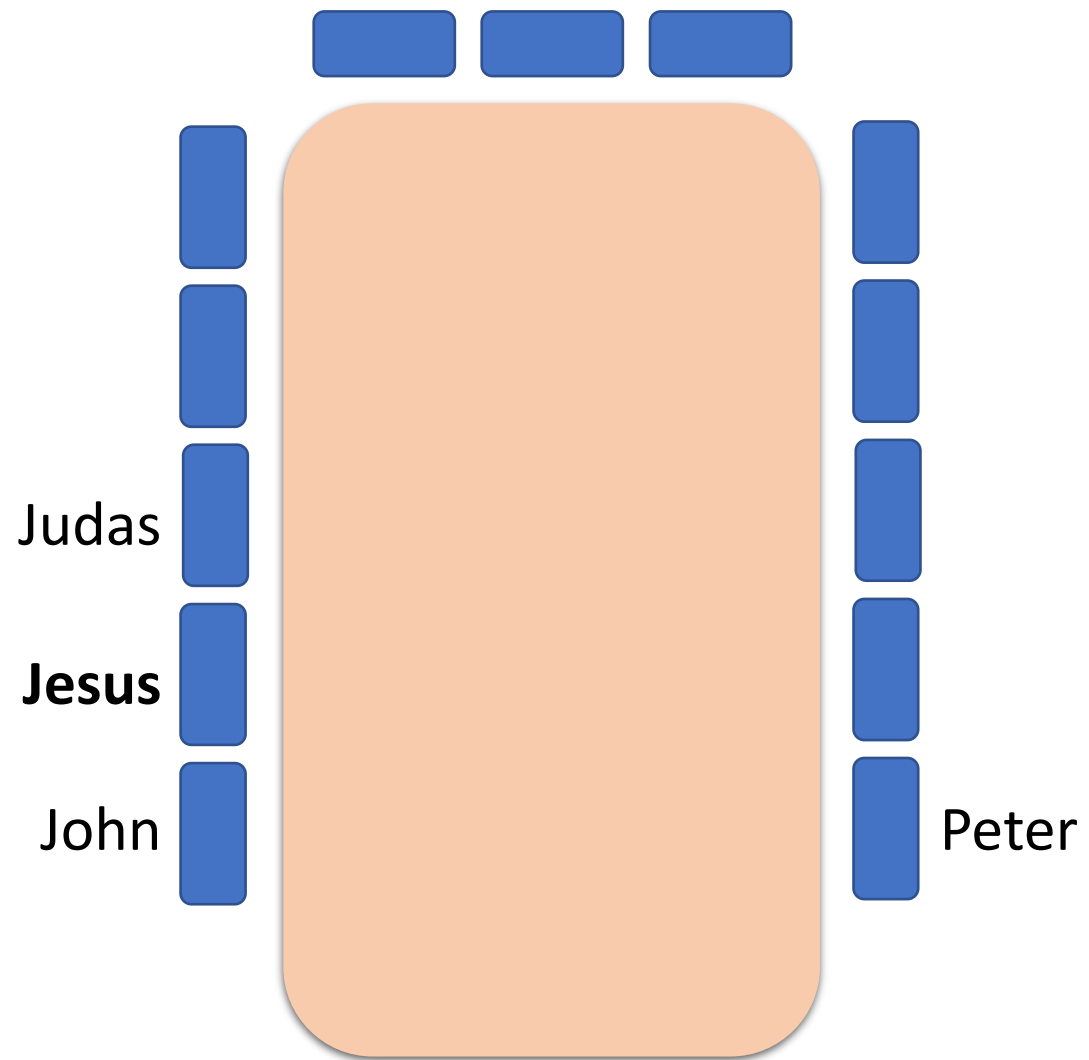
*“Where is the **guest room** in which I may eat the Passover with my disciples?”*


