(Judas agrees to betray Jesus for 30 pieces of silver)


Thursday


(John 7:46)

Judas




He sees his guilt

A field is purchased



And they led Him away to **Annas** first, for he was the father-in-law of Caiaphas who was high priest that year.

(John 18:13)

Annas asks Jesus about His disciples and His teaching.

"Ask those who have heard Me what I said to them..."


"Do you answer the high priest like that?"

"If I have spoken evil, bear witness of the evil; but if well, why do you strike me?"

Then Annas sent Him bound to **Caiaphas** the high priest.

(John 18:24)

Annas was High Priest for 10 years (6-15AD). He remained as one of the nation's most influential political and social individuals - his five sons served as High Priests, and his son-in-law **Caiaphas**.

Then to Pilate

This fellow said, 'I am able to destroy the temple of God and to build it in three days.'

(Matthew 26:61)

And those who had laid hold of Jesus led Him away to Caiaphas the high priest, where the scribes and the elders were assembled.

(Matthew 26:57)

They sought false testimony against Jesus to put Him to death, **but found none** because their testimonies did not agree...

The high priest arose and said to Him, "Do you answer nothing?" ...

But Jesus kept silent.

"I put you under oath by the living God:

Tell us if you are the Christ, the Son of God!"

Matthew 26

Mark 14

Luke 22

Tell us if You are the Christ, the Son of God!

Are You the Christ, the Son of the Blessed?

If You are the Christ, tell us.

It is as you said.

Nevertheless, I say to you, hereafter you will see the Son of Man sitting at the right hand of the Power, and coming on the clouds of heaven.

I am.

And you will see the Son of Man sitting at the right hand of the Power, and coming with the clouds of heaven.

Hereafter the Son of Man will sit on the right hand of the power of God.

Then they all said, "Are You then the Son of God?"

So He said to them, "You rightly say that I am."

Till I make Your enemies


Your footstool."

(Mark 14:66-67)




"I neither know nor understand what you are saying."

He returns the money

He commits suicide

They buy a field

Then Judas ... seeing that He had been condemned, regretted what he had done and brought back the thirty pieces of silver ...

"I have sinned by betraying innocent blood."

(Matthew 27:3-4)

A change of mind, not heart


"It is not lawful to put them into the treasury, because they are the price of blood"

And they consulted together and bought with them the potter's field, to bury strangers in. (Matthew 27:7)

"Now this man [Judas] purchased a field with the wages of iniquity; and falling headlong, he burst open in the middle and all his entrails gushed out.

... so that field is called ... Field of Blood."

(Acts 1:18-19)

Before the Sanhedrin (though not formally)

When morning came, all the chief priests and elders of the people plotted against Jesus to put Him to death. (Matthew 27:1) Immediately, in the morning, the chief priests held a consultation with the elders and scribes and the whole council...

(Mark 15:1)

Then the whole multitude of them arose and led Him to Pilate.

(Luke 23:1)

Pontius Pilate was the 5th governor of the Roman province of Judaea, serving under the emperor Tiberius from 26/27 to 36/37 AD.

Then to Caiaphas

Then to Pilate

Then to Herod

Then back to Pilate

Then they led Jesus from Caiaphas to the Praetorium, and **it was early morning**. Pilate then went out to them... (John 18:28-29)

What accusation do you bring against this man?

You take him and judge him according to your law.

If he were not an evildoer, we would not have delivered him up to you.

It is not lawful for us to put anyone to death.

We found this fellow perverting the nation, and forbidding to pay taxes to Caesar, saying that He Himself is Christ, a King. (Luke 23:2)

Then Pilate entered the Praetorium again. (John 18:33)

Are you the King of the Jews?

Am I a Jew? What have you done?

Are You a king then?

Are you speaking for yourself about this...?

My kingdom is not of this world.

What is truth?

You say rightly that I am a king...
Everyone who is of the truth hears my voice.



He is taken to Annas

Then to Caiaphas

Then to Pilate

Then back to Pilate

And the chief priests accused Him of many things, but He answered nothing. (Mark 15:3)

I find no fault in this man.

He stirs up the people ... beginning from Galilee ...

And as soon as he knew that He belonged to Herod's jurisdiction, he sent Him to Herod, who was also in Jerusalem at that time.

(Luke 23:7)

After the death of **Herod the Great** in 4 BC, Augustus confirmed the testament of the dead king by making **Herod Antipas** tetrarch of Galilee and Perea, a region he would rule for the next 42 years.

Now when Herod saw Jesus, he was exceedingly glad ... because **he hoped to see some miracle done by Him**.

(Luke 23:8)

Then he questioned Him with many words, but He answered him nothing.

(Luke 23:9)

Then Herod, with his men of war, treated Him with contempt and mocked Him, arrayed Him in a gorgeous robe, and sent Him back to Pilate.

(Luke 23:11)

That very day Pilate and Herod became friends with each other... (Luke 23:12)

I find no fault in him at all.

I will chastise him and release him.

What evil has he done?
I will chastise him and release him.

Have nothing to do with that just man, for I have suffered many things today in a dream because of him. (Matthew 27:19)

Not this man, but Barabbas!

Crucify him, crucify him!

I am innocent of the blood of this just person.

You see to it

His blood be on us and on our children.



Then Pilate took Jesus and scourged Him

(John 19:1)

(John 19:4)

Behold the man!

Crucify him, crucify him!

He made Himself the Son of God.

You take Him and crucify Him, for I find no fault in Him.

(John 19:6)

When Pilate heard that saying, he was the more afraid, and went again into the Praetorium. (John 19:8-9)

Where are you from?

Are you not speaking to me?
... I have power to crucify you,
and power to release you...

You could have no power at all against me unless it had been given you from above.

From then on Pilate sought to release Him...

If you let this man go, you are not Caesar's friend. Whoever makes himself a king speaks against Caesar.

When Pilate heard that, he brought Jesus out and sat down in the judgment seat... (John 19:13)

Behold your king!

Shall I crucify your king?

Away with him, crucify him!

We have no king but Caesar.

Then he delivered Him to them to be crucified.
