Only the High Priest entered, once a year

Daily ministry by the priests

The Mercy Seat and Cherubim on the Ark

The Second of incense

The Table for the Showbread

The Lampstand

"Let them make Me a sanctuary, that I may dwell among them."

(Exodus 25:8)

#### Where are we up to?



The way into the Holiest of All was not yet made manifest (Hebrews 9:8)



...how much more shall the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered Himself without spot to God, cleanse your conscience from dead works to serve the living God?

(Hebrews 9:14)

#### Where to now?

#### The question:

Why was the Messiah's death necessary?

#### The answer:

- Verses 16-18 God's covenants with His people are secured by a sacrifice.
   Verses 19-22 The covenant God made with Israel at Sinai was made with blood.
  - But the first covenant concerned earthly things, pictures of the heavenly.
  - The heavenly reality requires a better sacrifice.
- The Lord Jesus died as that better sacrifice.
  - He will return to bring eternal salvation to His people.

#### Understanding the text...



Because He entered in with His own blood

διαθήκη (diathēkē) = covenant or testament.

And for this reason He is the Mediator of the new covenant, by means of death,

for the redemption of the transgressions under **the first covenant**, that those who are called

may receive the promise of the eternal inheritance.

(Hebrews 9:15)

### The promise of the eternal inheritance



A will, specifying what is inherited and who inherits it

For where there is a testament, there must also of necessity be the death of the testator.

For a testament is in force after death, since it has no power at all while the testator lives.

The person making the will

(Hebrews 9:16-17)



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#### By means of death



A covenant, such as the one made by God at Mt Sinai.

<u>For</u> where there is a <u>covenant</u>, there must also of necessity be the death of the <u>covenant-maker</u>.

For a covenant is in force over dead ones, Literal since it has no power at all while the covenant-maker lives.

The one who dies to establish the covenant.

(Hebrews 9:16-17)

A sacrifice

Therefore not even the first covenant was dedicated without blood.

(Hebrews 9:18)



"This cup
is the
new covenant
in my blood"

For when Moses had spoken every precept to all the people ... [he] sprinkled both the book itself and all the people, saying,

"This is the blood of the covenant which God has commanded you."

... Exodus 24:8

And according to the law almost all things are purified with blood, and without shedding of blood there is no remission.

(Hebrews 9:19-22)

Freedom, deliverance, forgiveness, pardon



For Christ has not entered the holy places made with hands, which are copies of the true, but into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God for us;

The High Priest in the Most Holy Place

as the high priest enters the Most Holy Place every year ...

...but now, once at the end of the ages, He has appeared to put away sin by the sacrifice of Himself.

(Hebrews 9:24-26)
