But Peter and John answered...

(Acts 4:31)




WHAT DID WE SEE?

Their message:

- His death was God's plan, foretold by the prophets


Their manner:

The multitude of those who believed:

- They were of one heart and one soul
- > They had all things in common

None among them lacked anything:

- > All who had lands or houses sold them
- > They distributed to each as anyone had need

With great power the apostles were giving witness to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus. (Acts 4:33) Many signs and wonders were regularly done among the people by the hands of **the apostles**.

(Acts 5:12)

They even carried out the sick into the streets and laid them on cots and mats, that as Peter came by at least his shadow might fall on some of them.



The people also gathered from the towns around Jerusalem, bringing the sick and those afflicted with unclean spirits, and they were all healed.



They were all together in Solomon's Portico.

None of the rest **dared** join them, but the people esteemed them highly.

And more than ever **believers were added to the Lord**, multitudes of both men and women...





So great fear came upon all the church and upon all who heard these things. (Acts 5:11)


Life and Death

When we are judged, we are **disciplined** by the Lord, that we may not be **condemned** with the world. (1 Corinthians 11:32)

TWO QUESTIONS:

- > Why did the Lord do this?
- Does it still happen?

There is sin leading to death. (1 John 5:16)

But at night an angel of the Lord opened the prison doors and brought them out... (Acts 5:19)

Go, stand in the temple and speak to the people all the words of this life.

We found the prison securely locked and the guards standing at the doors, but when we opened them **we found no one inside**!

(Acts 5:23)

Look, the men whom you put in prison are standing in the temple and **teaching the people**! (Acts 5:25)

Did we not strictly command you not to teach in this name?

And look, you have filled Jerusalem with your doctrine, and intend to bring this man's blood on us! (Acts 5:28)



We ought to obey God rather than men.

The God of our fathers raised up Jesus whom you murdered by hanging on a tree.

Him God has exalted to His right handto be Prince and Saviour,to give repentance to Israel and forgiveness of sins.

And we are His witnesses to these things, and **so also is the Holy Spirit**

whom God has given to those who obey Him.

(Acts 5:29-32)

If this plan or this undertaking is of man, it will fail; but if it is of God, you will not be able to overthrow them. You might even be found opposing God! (Acts 5:38-39)



...and when they had called for the apostles **and beaten them**, they commanded that they should not speak in the name of Jesus, and let them go. (Acts 5:40)

So they departed from the presence of the council, rejoicing that they were counted worthy to suffer shame for His name.

And daily in the temple, and in every house, they did not cease **teaching** and **preaching Jesus as the Christ**. (Acts 5:41-42)




The time is coming that whoever kills you will think that he is offering service to God. (John 16:2)
