





8. Phillip (Acts 8)



Lord, do not charge them with this sin.

And the witnesses laid down their clothes at the feet of a young man named Saul.

(Acts 7:58)



And Saul approved of his execution. (Acts 8:1)

Trying to destroy it

Saul was ravaging the church, and entering house after house, he dragged off men and women and committed them to prison. (Acts 8:3)

Therefore

those who were scattered went everywhere preaching the word. (Acts 8:4)


Then Philip went down [from Jerusalem] to the city of Samaria and preached Christ to them. (Acts 8:5)

So there was great joy in that city. (Acts 8:8)



But there was a certain man called Simon...

(Acts 8:9)



But when they believed Philip as he preached the things concerning the kingdom of God and the name of Jesus Christ, both men and women were **baptised**.

(Acts 8:12)

Then Simon himself also **believed**; and when he was baptised he continued with Philip, and was amazed, seeing the miracles and signs which were done. (Acts 8:13)

QUESTION: What did Phillip preach? Now when the apostles who were at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had received the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them, who, when they had come down, prayed for them that they might receive the Holy Spirit. (Acts 8:14-15)

> Then they laid hands on them, and **they received the Holy Spirit**. (Acts 8:17)

By one Spirit we were all baptised into one body... (1 Corinthians 12:13)

And when Simon saw ... he offered them money... (Acts 8:18)

May your silver, together with you, be sent into **destruction** because you thought you could obtain the **gift of God** with **money**!

Therefore **repent** of this **wickedness** of yours...


(Acts 8:20,22)

"Arise and go toward the south along the road which goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza." (Acts 8:26)






A man of Ethiopia, a eunuch of great authority ... had come to Jerusalem to worship...

...and he went on his way rejoicing. (Acts 8:39)




But Philip was found at **Azotus**.
