




14. The conference at Jerusalem (Acts 15)









And after they had passed through **Pisidia**, they came to **Pamphylia**. Now when they had preached the word in **Perga**, they went down to **Attalia**.

From there they sailed to Antioch.

Now when they had come and gathered the church together, they reported all that God had done with them, and that He had opened the door of faith to the Gentiles.

So they stayed there a long time with the disciples.

Overview...

The possible sequence of events...

- Paul and Barnabas return to Antioch (Acts 14:28)
- Peter comes to Antioch (Galatians 2:11)
- Certain men came from James in Jerusalem (Galatians 2:12, Acts 15:1)
- Paul challenges Peter' publicly (Galatians 2:11-14)
- Paul hears that Jews have deceived the Galatians.
- Paul writes the letter to the Galatian churches
- Paul and Barnabas go to Jerusalem to the apostles and elders (Acts 15:2)
- The apostles write to the churches about Gentiles and the Law (Acts 15:22-29)

Contend earnestly for the faith... (Jude 1:3)

WHAT WAS THE PROBLEM?

Many Jews in Jerusalem (including some Pharisees) who had come to believe that Jesus was the Christ, still held onto the various outward customs of the Law of Moses.

They believed that for Gentiles to be saved, they had to, in essence, become Jewish and follow these customs while they were also trusting in Christ Jesus.

They therefore believed salvation to be possible only through faith in Christ <u>PLUS</u> obedience to the Law.

WHAT WAS PAUL'S ANSWER?

The Law **exposes our sin**, but it cannot save us.

Salvation is only possible through faith in the Lord Jesus, His death and resurrection.



PAUL STANDS FIRM

WHAT HAPPENED?

Now when Peter had come to Antioch,

I opposed him to his face, because he was to be blamed;



for before certain men came from James, he would eat with the Gentiles; but when they came, **he withdrew and separated himself**,

fearing those who were of the circumcision.

HOW DID IT AFFECT OTHERS?

And the rest of the Jews also played the hypocrite with him, so that **even Barnabas** was carried away with their **hypocrisy**.

(Galatians 2:11-13)



Jews were not supposed to eat with Gentiles

They followed Peter's example

PAUL CHALLENGES PETER

"If you, though a Jew, live like a Gentile and not like a Jew, how can you force the Gentiles to live like Jews?"

(Galatians 2:14)



so we [Jews] also have **believed in Christ Jesus**, in order to be justified **by faith in Christ** and **not by works of the law**,

because by works of the law no one will be justified.

(Galatians 2:15-16)





If righteousness comes through the law, then Christ died in vain.

(Galatians 2:21)

WHAT (probably) HAPPENS NEXT?

Peter leaves Antioch...

News arrives in Antioch that the believers in **Galatia** have been told that **they must come under the Law of Moses**!

They have also been told that **Paul is not a proper apostle**, and that the apostles in Jerusalem sent these "teachers" to correct Paul's teaching – they said he had **left things out!**

Paul is VERY angry and upset – false shepherds (!!#!#!!) have led these new believers into bondage to the Law!


He decides to write to them!

As we have said before, so now I say again: If anyone is preaching to you a gospel contrary to the one you received, let him be accursed. You foolish Galatians!

More from Galatians

But I make known to you, brethren, that the gospel which was preached by me is not according to man.

For I neither received it from man, nor was I taught it, but it came through the revelation of Jesus Christ.

There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is neither male nor female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus.



Continuing disagreement...



...they determined that **Paul** and **Barnabas** and certain others of them should go up to **Jerusalem**, to the apostles and elders, about this question.

(Acts 15:2)

So, being sent on their way by the church, they passed through **Phoenicia** and **Samaria**, describing the conversion of the Gentiles; and they caused **great joy** to all the brethren.

(Acts 15:3)



And when they had come to Jerusalem, they were received by the church and the apostles and the elders; and they reported all things that God had done with them.



(Acts 15:4)

It is necessary
to circumcise them,

Now the apostles and elders came together to consider this matter.

And after there had been much debate, Peter stood up and said...

God ... made no distinction between us and them, purifying their hearts by faith...



Peter

(See Acts 15:7-11)

We believe that through the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ we shall be saved in the same manner as they.

The Lord "was bearing witness to the word of His grace, granting signs and wonders to be done by their hands." (Acts 14:3)

Then all the multitude kept silent and listened to **Barnabas** and **Paul** declaring how many miracles and wonders God had worked through them **among the Gentiles**.

(Acts 15:12)

After they finished speaking, James replied, "Men and brethren, listen to me..."

The Letter (see Acts 15:23-29)

The apostles, the elders, and the brethren,

To the brethren who are of the Gentiles in Antioch, Syria, and Cilicia: Greetings.

Since we have heard that some who went out from us have troubled you with words, unsettling your souls, saying, "You must be circumcised and keep the law"—to whom we gave no such commandment—

it seemed good to us, being assembled with one accord, to send chosen men to you with our beloved Barnabas and Paul, men who have risked their lives for the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. We have therefore sent Judas and Silas, who will also report the same things by word of mouth.

For it seemed good to the Holy Spirit, and to us, to lay upon you no greater burden than these necessary things: that you abstain from things offered to idols, from blood, from things strangled, and from sexual immorality.

If you keep yourselves from these, you will do well.

So when they were sent off, they came to Antioch...






- The letter is delivered and received with joy

- They return to Jerusalem

Barnabas: Yes, and we can take Mark with us...

And there arose a sharp disagreement, so that they separated from each other.

(Acts 15:39)


Barnabas took Mark with him and sailed away to Cyprus...
