Chapter 13:1-9

What do these instructions tell us about the church?

1. Continue brotherly love (13:1) → **Love** is the mark of a true disciple
2. Show hospitality to strangers (13:2) → The Lord has only **one church**
3. Remember those in prison (13:3) → The church will suffer **persecution**
4. Hold marriage in honour (13:4) → Its **standards** are not from the world
5. Be content with what you have (13:5-6) → It answers **the upward call** of Christ
6. Remember, consider, imitate... (13:7-8) → It walks in **the way of faith** in Christ
7. Be established in grace (13:9) → It holds and lives **the truth** of Christ

Let us offer the sacrifice of praise...

from which any of the blood
is brought into the tabernacle of meeting,
to make atonement in the holy place,
shall be eaten.

It shall be burned in the fire.

(Leviticus 6:30)

We have an altar from which those who serve the tabernacle have no right to eat.

The picture

For the bodies of those **animals** whose **blood** is brought into the holy places by the high priest as a **sacrifice for sin** are **burned** outside the camp.

(Hebrews 13:11)

So **Jesus** also **suffered** outside the gate in order to **sanctify the people** through **His own blood**.

So
Jesus also
suffered

His own blood.

Therefore
let us go to Him
outside the camp
and bear His reproach,
for here we have no lasting city,
but **we seek the city that is to come.**
(Hebrews 13:12-14)



Two different sacrifices

The Sabbath

The price has been paid.
Our response is worship.

- 1 **Therefore** by Him
let us continually offer **the sacrifice of praise to God**,
that is, the fruit of our lips, giving thanks to His name.
(Hebrews 13:15)

- 2 But do not forget **to do good and to share**,
for with **such sacrifices** God is well pleased.

Submission and grace

Obey those who lead you and **be submissive**, for they are **keeping watch** over your souls, as those who will have **to give an account**.

(Hebrews 13:17)

Let them do this with joy and not with groaning, for that would be unprofitable for you.

I especially urge you to do this, that I may be restored to you the sooner.
