Pergamum in history

Pergamum was the seat of a Roman regional assembly. Pliny the Elder (23 – 79 AD) refers to it as the most important city in the province.











The Pergamum Library



The library, built between 220 and 159 BC, had apparently housed about 200,000 volumes.



The Latin "pergamenum charta" was used in ancient Rome to refer to the writing material produced in Pergamum. This was eventually shortened to "parchment".


Or messenger

My faithful witness

who was killed among you, where Satan dwells.

(Revelation 2:13)

Jesus Christ, the faithful witness (Revelation 1:5 and Revelation 3:14)

But I have a few things against you:

you have **some** there who hold the teaching of **Balaam**,

Numbers 22 to 24

Numbers 25

who taught **Balak** to put a stumbling block before the sons of Israel, so that they might eat things sacrificed to idols, and to practice sexual immorality.

(Revelation 2:14)

2 Peter 2:15:

Forsaking the right way, they have gone astray.
They have followed the way of Balaam, the son of Beor, who **loved gain from wrongdoing**...

Jude 11:

Woe to them!

For they ... have **run greedily** in the error of Balaam **for profit**...






Come now, curse this people for me, since they are too mighty for me he whom you bless is blessed, and he whom you curse is cursed.

(Numbers 22:6)

The LORD your God would not listen to Balaam, but the LORD your God turned **the curse** into **a blessing** for you, because the LORD your God **loves** you.

(Deuteronomy 23:5)



...who taught **Balak** to put a **stumbling block** before the sons of Israel...

- To eat things sacrificed to idols,
- To practice sexual immorality.

The women of Moab...
invited the people
to the sacrifices of their gods...

and the people ate and bowed down to their gods.

So Israel yoked himself to Baal of Peor. (Numbers 25:1-3)



What was the witness of Israel?




I bore you on eagles' wings and brought you to Myself.



So also you have some who hold the teaching of **the Nicolaitans**.


(Revelation 2:15)

The Nicolaitans?



Irenaeus (c. 130-202) wrote that the Nicolaitans followed Nicolas (Acts 6:5) who promoted an immoral lifestyle. So too **Hippolytus** (c. 170-235).

2 Nicolaitan – in Greek a compound word from nikos (to conquer or subdue) and laos (the people). Perhaps an elite group ruling over ordinary believers.



Therefore **repent**.

If we would judge ourselves, we would not be judged.

But when we are judged, we are chastened by the Lord, that we may not be condemned with the world.

(1 Corinthians 11:31-32)

If not, I will come to you soon and war against them with the sword of my mouth.

(Revelation 2:16)
