Romans 1:16-19



For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek.

For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith to faith, as it is written, "The righteous shall live by faith."

For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who by their unrighteousness suppress the truth.

For what can be known about God is plain to them, because God has shown it to them.

Unwilling to repent

But because of your hard and impenitent heart you are **storing up wrath for yourself** on the day of wrath when God's righteous judgment will be revealed.

If you

- rely on the law
- boast in God

- approve what is excellent

If you are sure that you yourself are

- a guide to the blind
- a light to those who are in darkness
- an instructor of the foolish
- a teacher of children

You then who teach others, do you not teach yourself?

Man looks at the outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart.
(1 Samuel 16:7)

For no one is a Jew who is merely one **outwardly**, nor is circumcision outward and physical.

But a Jew is one **inwardly**, and circumcision is a matter of the heart, by the Spirit, not by the letter.

His praise is not from man but from God.

(Romans 2:28-29)

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Man looks at the outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart.
(1 Samuel 16:7)

For no one is a Christian who is merely one outwardly...

But a **Christian** is one **inwardly...**

His praise is not from man but from God.



Therefore you have no excuse, O man, every one of you who judges. For in passing judgment on another you condemn yourself, because you, the judge, practice the very same things. (Romans 2:1 ESV)

Therefore you are inexcusable, O man, whoever you are who judge, for in whatever you judge another you condemn yourself; for you who judge practice the same things.

(Romans 2:1 NKJV)
