For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith to faith, as it is written, "The righteous shall live by faith."

For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who by their unrighteousness suppress the truth.

For what can be known about God is plain to them, because God has shown it to them.



Therefore you have no excuse, O man, every one of you who judges.
For in passing judgment on another you condemn yourself, because you, the judge, practice the very same things.

(Romans 2:1 ESV)

Therefore you are inexcusable, O man, whoever you are who judge, for in whatever you judge another you condemn yourself; for you who judge practice the same things.

(Romans 2:1 NKJV)

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Then what advantage has the Jew?

Much in every way.

To begin with, the Jews were entrusted with the oracles of God.

(See Romans 3:1-2)

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What if some were unfaithful? Does their faithlessness nullify the faithfulness of God?

By no means! Let God be true though every one were a liar...

(See Romans 3:3-4)

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But if our unrighteousness serves to show the righteousness of God, what shall we say? That God is unrighteous to inflict wrath on us?

By no means! For then how could God judge the world?

(Romans 3:5-6)

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But if through my lie God's truth abounds to His glory, why am I still being condemned as a sinner?
And why not (as some say) do evil that good may come?

Their condemnation is just.

(See Romans 3:7-8)

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What then? Are we Jews any better off?

No, not at all.

For we have already charged that **all**, both Jews and Greeks, are under sin, as it is written:

"There is none righteous, no, not one..."
(Romans 3:9-10)

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"There is none righteous, no, not one no one understands; no one seeks for God.

All have turned aside; together they have become worthless; no one does good, not even one."

Know the meaning: **Justification**

Imagine a man on trial for a crime he committed.

The evidence shows that he is guilty and he confess to having committed the crime.

The law rightly condemns him as guilty.

However, when he comes to announce the sentence, the judge says that the guilty criminal is free to go!

This is the meaning of **justification** in this letter.

It is a legal term – a declaration that God no longer condemns the sinner but now sees him as righteous.

Just as if
he had never
committed
the crime!



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Now we know that whatever the law says it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be stopped, and the whole world may be held accountable to God.

For by works of the law no human being will be justified in His sight, since through the law comes knowledge of sin.

(Romans 3:19-20)

Know the meaning: **Redemption**

Imagine a man has been taken captive by an enemy and then sold into slavery.

His brother goes looking for him and, when he finds him, he finds that **he is a slave**, owned by a master who refuses to set him free. **How can he rescue his brother?**

He **buys him** from the owner by paying the price for a slave. He **redeems** his brother and, in that way, **sets him free**.

This is the meaning of **redemption**.

When the Lord Jesus was crucified, He paid the high price necessary to set us free from our slavery to sin.

Know the meaning: **Propitiation**

Imagine that a very important or powerful man is **extremely angry** with you, and **you deserve his anger**.

You want to make peace and restore the relationship, so something must be done to turn away his anger. You are looking for a way to **propitiate** him. He will have been **propitiated** only when he is no longer angry with you.

How is God's righteous anger towards sinners propitiated?

Peace has been made through the death of the Lord Jesus. His death for us has become the propitiation that has turned away God's wrath from us.



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But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it—the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe.

For there is no distinction: for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified by His grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus...

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...through the **redemption** that is in Christ Jesus whom God put forward as a **propitiation** by His blood, to be received by faith.

This was to show God's righteousness, because in His divine forbearance He had passed over former sins.

It was to show His righteousness at the present time, so that He might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus.

(Romans 3:25-26)

So that He might be just and the justifier...



Guilty!

Will the judge be kind to his friend, or will he be just?

What will the judge do?

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Then what becomes of our boasting?

It is excluded.

By what kind of law? By a law of works?

No, but by the law of faith.

We must trust in Jesus because we don't deserve and we can't earn salvation at all

For we hold that one is justified by faith apart from works of the law.

(Romans 3:27-28)

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For we hold that one is justified by faith apart from works of the law.



Romans 3:21-24

ESV:

But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe.

For there is no distinction: for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified by His grace as a gift,

NKJV:

But now the righteousness of God apart from the law is revealed, being witnessed by the Law and the Prophets, even the righteousness of God, through faith in Jesus Christ, to all and on all who believe.

For there is no difference; for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, being justified freely by His grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus... through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus...
