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Romans 1:16-17

ESV:

For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek.

For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith to faith, as it is written, "The righteous shall live by faith."

NKJV:

For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ, for it is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes, for the Jew first and also for the Greek.

For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith to faith; as it is written, "The just shall live by faith."



Romans 1:18-19

ESV:

For **the wrath of God** is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who by their unrighteousness suppress the truth.

For what can be known about God is plain to them, because God has shown it to them.

NKJV:

For **the wrath of God** is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who suppress the truth in unrighteousness, because what may be known of God is manifest in them, for God has shown it to them.



Romans 2:1

ESV:

Therefore you have no excuse, O man, every one of you who judges. For in passing judgment on another you condemn yourself, because you, the judge, practice the very same things.

NKJV:

Therefore you are inexcusable, O man, whoever you are who judge, for in whatever you judge another you condemn yourself; for you who judge practice the same things.



Romans 3:21-24

But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe.

For there is no distinction: for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified by His grace as a gift,

NKJV:

But now the righteousness of God apart from the law is revealed, being witnessed by the Law and the Prophets, even the righteousness of God, through faith in Jesus Christ, to all and on all who believe.

For there is no difference; for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, being justified freely by His grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus... through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus...



Psalm 32:1-2

ESV:

Blessed is the one whose transgression is forgiven, whose sin is covered.

Blessed is the man against whom the LORD counts no iniquity, and in whose spirit there is no deceit.

NKJV:

Blessed is he whose transgression is forgiven,

Whose sin is covered.

Blessed is the man to whom the LORD does not impute iniquity, And in whose spirit there is no deceit.



Romans 5:1-2

ESV:

Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ.

Through Him we have also obtained access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and we rejoice in hope of the glory of God.

NKJV:

Therefore,
having been justified by faith,
we have peace with God
through our Lord Jesus Christ,

through whom also we have access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and rejoice in hope of the glory of God.

Know the meaning: **Justification**

Imagine a man on trial for a crime he committed.

The evidence shows that he is guilty and he confess to having committed the crime.

The law rightly condemns him as guilty.

But when the judge comes to sentence him, he says that the guilty criminal is innocent and free to go!

This is the meaning of justification in this letter.

It is a legal term – a declaration that God no longer condemns the sinner but now sees him as righteous.

Just as if he had never done wrong!

Romans 6

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Remember chapter 5?
Where sin abounded,
grace abounded
much more...

What shall we say then?

Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound?

By no means!

How can we who died to sin still live in it?

(Romans 6:1-2)

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Greek: *baptizō* = to immerse or submerge...

Do you not know that all of us who have been baptised **into** Christ Jesus were baptised **into** His death?

We were buried therefore with Him by baptism **into** death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.

What is this Life?

(Romans 6:3-4)

We were buried with Him
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...in order that just as Christ was raised from the dead... we too might walk in newness of life.

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For if we have been united with Him in a death like His, we shall certainly be united with Him in a resurrection like His.



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We know that our **old self** was crucified with Him in order that **the body of sin** might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be **enslaved to sin**.

For one who has died has been set free from sin.

(Romans 6:6-7)



Chapter	Verses	Content

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Now if we have **died with Christ**, we believe that **we will also live with Him**.

We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will **never die again**; death no longer has dominion over Him.

For the death He died He died to sin, once for all, but the life He lives He lives to God.

(Romans 6:8-10)

This is the **first** instruction Paul gives to the believers in Rome.

So you also must consider yourselves

dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

(Romans 6:11)

Therefore
do not let sin reign in your mortal body,
to make you obey its passions.

(Romans 6:12)

Don't let sin reign!

Do not present your members to sin

as instruments for unrighteousness,

but present yourselves to God

as those who have been brought from death to life, and *present* your members to God as instruments for righteousness.

For sin will have no dominion over you, since you are not under law but under grace.

(Romans 6:13-14)

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Choose this day whom you will serve... (Joshua 24:15)

What then?

Are we to sin because we are not under law but under grace?

By no means!

Do you not know that if you present yourselves to anyone as obedient slaves, you are slaves of the one whom you obey, either of **sin**, which leads to **death**, or of **obedience**, which leads to **righteousness**?

(Romans 6:15-16)

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Everyone who practices sin is a slave to sin. (John 8:34)

But thanks be to God, that you who were once slaves of sin have become obedient from the heart to the standard of teaching to which you were committed, and, having been set free from sin, have become slaves of righteousness.

(Romans 6:17-18)

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But what fruit were you getting at that time from the things of which you are now ashamed? For the end of those things is **death**.

Willingly, joyfully and thankfully But now that you have been set free from sin and have become slaves of God, the fruit you get leads to sanctification and its end, eternal life.

(Romans 6:21-22)

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The Law demands righteousness
