Serving the Lord in Uruguay



Dear Friends,

Uruguay is home to roughly 3.5 million people, 1.4 million of whom live in the capital, Montevideo (where we live!). Because such a high percentage of Uruguay's population live in the capital, a lot of the country's activity focuses on developing and resourcing this city. For many years, the work of the CBU has been like this - focused on the University campuses based in Montevideo. But over the last year or so, we've been trying to expand our work to the west side of Uruguay that borders Argentina, where there are a number of university faculties and technical colleges.

Since December last year, Toto (the CBU general secretary) and Pedro have made three trips to visit churches and make connections with key Christian leaders in Mercedes, Fray Bentos, and Paysandú. Their last trip was over the first weekend of June, when they ran a weekend away in Mercedes to train up students to lead Bible studies in the places where they study. Pedro gave three talks on the word of God (its nature and purpose; how to understand it correctly and; its role in evangelism), as well as giving a workshop on how to write Bible studies.

What we found was that almost all the students at the camp were new to an inductive way of studying the Bible. (By an inductive approach, we mean asking questions of a biblical passage to help us arrive at the main idea of the text - you're probably very familiar and well practised in it!) It was great to teach and model this approach at the camp, but these students need ongoing support - support that is hard to give when we're geographically far away. There were other challenges too. Student life in these regional centres appears to be even less lively than that of Montevideo. So how do we inspire and motivate students to maximise their time and presence on campus for evangelism and Christian fellowship?



There were encouragements too. We met students who are hungry to know God's word better and share it with others. We met students who appear willing to take on leadership roles. And we sense future opportunities for theological training (using MOCLAM, for example) as relationships with pastors and youth group leaders grow and trust develops.

We're thankful for the weekend away and the potential openings for future ministry beyond Montevideo's borders. And we need a great deal of prayer as we seek to support the Christian youth and campus work in Uruguay's west. Please pray that those who attended the weekend away and heard about inductive Bible study would learn to use these tools well and grow in their knowledge of God through his word. Pray also for us! Pray for wisdom as we work out how to invest time and resources in regional Uruguay whilst continuing our ministry in Montevideo. Pray for insight and creativity as we deal with the challenges of ministering from afar. And pray that our partnership with churches in Uruguay's west would strengthen as a source of mutual edification.



Thank God for the opportunity to meet and teach these students who live and study on Uruguay's west.

- for another trip around the sun for Joy! It was a low-key day filled with reminders of God's kindness to us and expressions of love and friendship from family and friends, both near and far.


