A preposition meaning "out of"

ek + klesia

A derivative of the verb *kaleo* meaning "**to call**"



Referring to a gathering of citizens in Ephesus (See Acts 19:32, 39, 41)



An assembly of people "called out"



Referring to people redeemed by Christ

(See Matthew 16:18, Ephesians 1:22)

"And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build My church,

and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it."






