Matthew 5:17-20 - Four verses - three great and profound truths

Do not think that I came to destroy the Law or the Prophets. I did not come to destroy but to fulfill.

For assuredly, I say to you, till heaven and earth pass away, one jot or one tittle will by no means pass from the law till all is fulfilled.

Whoever therefore breaks one of the least of these commandments, and teaches men so, shall be called least in the kingdom of heaven; but whoever does and teaches them, he shall be called great in the kingdom of heaven.

For I say to you, that unless your righteousness exceeds the righteousness of the scribes and Pharisees, you will by no means enter the kingdom of heaven.


The Old Testament scriptures

(Matthew 5:17)

plēroo = to cram (a net), level up (a hollow), fill, finish, accomplish, perfect

How will the Lord Jesus fulfill the Law and the Prophets?

- ✓ The full meaning of the Law will be made clear
 - "You have heard that it was said, but I say to you..."
 - God's eternal purpose will be accomplished and revealed
- ✓ He will personally fulfill all the Law's requirements.
 - He made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us... (2 Corinthians 5:21)
- ✓ The prophesies concerning the Messiah will be fulfilled.
 - He explained to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning Himself. (Luke 24:27)
- ✓ The types and pictures will be fulfilled.
 - Since the law has but a shadow of the good things to come instead of the true form of these realities... (Hebrews 10:1)




Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets...


