

The form of each message

EPHESUS in history

Ephesus was very **prosperous** in the first century.

It was a major centre of commerce.

It was famous for the **Temple of Artemis**.



EPHESUS in history

Ephesus was very **prosperous** in the first century.

It was a major centre of commerce.

It was famous for the **Temple of Artemis**.

Ephesus was destroyed by the Goths in 262 AD.

Despite some rebuilding the city's position and importance declined as its harbour silted up.



EPHESUS in the New Testament

> Acts 18

- Paul visited Ephesus with Priscilla and Aquila on his 2nd journey (c. 52 AD).
- Apollos later visited Ephesus and was further taught by Priscilla and Aquila.

> Acts 19

- Paul returned to Ephesus on his 3rd journey and **stayed about three years** (c. 54 AD).
- The Lord did extraordinary miracles, and believers burned valuable books on magic.
- After a riot in the city led by idol makers, Paul travelled west into Macedonia (c. 57 AD).

> Acts 20

- On his way to Jerusalem, Paul called for the elders in Ephesus to meet him in Miletus.
- He encouraged and warned them, knowing they would see him no more (c. 58 AD).

> An amazing letter

• Paul wrote "Ephesians" to the church in Ephesus while a prisoner in Rome (c. 62 AD).

Paul's warning to the elders in Ephesus

Pay careful attention to yourselves and to all the flock...

...after my departure fierce wolves will come in among you...

...and from among your own selves will arise men speaking twisted things, to draw away the disciples after them.

Therefore be alert, remembering that for three years I did not cease night or day to admonish every one with tears.

"It is more blessed to give than to receive."

(see Acts 20:17-38)



Paul's letter from Rome to Ephesus


Therefore I also, after I heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love for all the saints... (Ephesians 1:15-16)

For this reason I bow my knees...
that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith
—that you, being rooted and grounded in love...
(See Ephesians 3:14-19)

Therefore be imitators of God as dear children. And walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave Himself for us...

(Ephesians 5:1-2)





Ephesus:

- A pagan and prosperous city
- The church began well through Paul and others
- They were warned of the dangers ahead
- They were encouraged to walk in love

The Lord's message to Ephesus

Revelation 2:1-7

He is the head of the Church

To the angel of the church in Ephesus write:

These things says He who holds the seven stars in His right hand, who walks in the midst of the seven golden lampstands...

(Revelation 2:1)

His heart is for His Church

I know your works,

your **toil** and your **patient endurance**, and how you cannot bear with those who are evil,

and have tested those who call themselves apostles and are not, and found them to be false.

I know you are enduring patiently and bearing up for My name's sake, and you have not grown weary.

(Revelation 2:2-3)

Nevertheless I have this against you, that you have left your first love.

(Revelation 2:4)

The love you had at first. (Acts 19:17-20, Acts 20:36-38)


