

Luke 6:37-38:

Judge not, and you will not be judged; condemn not, and you will not be condemned; forgive, and you will be forgiven; give, and it will be given to you. Good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap.

For with the measure you use it will be measured back to you.



Pause and consider:

- The Lord is speaking to His disciples
- He speaks to them of their Father in heaven
- He is teaching them how to live as His disciples
- They are to be **truly righteous** from the heart
- God will be to them what they are to others
 - ✓ Do not judge and you will not be judged
 - ✓ The measure you use will be measured to you
 - ✓ Forgive and you will be forgiven

Why do you see **the speck** that is in your brother's eye, but do not notice **the log** that is in your own eye?

Let me take **the speck** out of your eye...

first take the log
out of your own eye,
and then you will see clearly
to take the speck
out of your brother's eye.

...you must no longer walk as the Gentiles do, in the futility of their minds.


They are **darkened** in their understanding, **alienated** from the life of God because of the **ignorance** that is in them, due to their **hardness** of heart.

Ask Seek Knock

Or which one of you, if his son asks him for **bread**, will give him a **stone**? Or if he asks for a **fish**, will give him a **serpent**? If you then, who are **evil**, **to your children**, **to your children**,



how much more will your Father who is in heaven give good things to those who ask Him!

(Matthew 7:9-11)
